## ADERHOLT SIGNS ON TO THE LOCAL RADIO FREE ACT

Representative Robert Aderholt became the fifth House member from the Alabama delegation to sign on as a cosponsor of HR 244. The "Local Radio Free Act" is essentially a policy statement supporting free local broadcast radio and opposing any new performance fees, taxes or royalties for the public performance of sound recordings over the airways.

As of today, Representatives Spencer Bachus and Artur Davis have not given their support to the Resolution. If you live and/or work in their districts, please send an e-mail or make a phone call to ask them to join the other five members of our delegation in support of local radio!



# **Sgt Dennis Crowe Deploying to Afghanistan**

Our Alabama Army National Guard contact and friend, Sgt Dennis Crowe is headed to Afghanistan early next year. He will spend three weeks at Fort Sam Houston between now and January 23<sup>rd</sup>. On the 23<sup>rd</sup>, he will report to Fort Riley, Kansas – his last stop before deployment overseas. He expects to be in Afghanistan for a year.

I asked Sgt Crowe if he and his group have all the equipment and supplies they need because we hear occasionally that soldiers have to purchase some of their own gear. He reported that the Alabama National Guard has made sure they have more than they need, including some special requests.

Sgt Crowe said he will send us notes as often as possible during his deployment.

Alabama has had the largest per capita number of National Guard members deployed since 9/11 and one of the largest percentages of men and women in all branches of the military, including veterans.

It should reflect information for the months of October, November, and December. The FCC's recent action adopting a new program report form, which is intended to replace the Quarterly Issues/Programs Lists, will not have any effect on this fourth quarter public file requirement.

Jan 10, 2008 Children's Television Programming Report must be filed with the FCC and placed in stations' local Public Inspection Files by this date. It should reflect programming aired during the months of October, November, and December.
